AN ACT Relating to elections; amending RCW 29A.08.210, 29A.08.110, 2 29A.08.615, 29A.40.091, 29A.60.125, and 29A.44.090; adding new sections 3 to chapter 29A.08 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 29A.04 RCW; 4 creating new sections; and repealing RCW 29A.08.010.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. FINDINGS. The people of the state of 7 Washington find as follows:

8 Voting is a citizen's precious right, and one that is violated 9 every time an ineligible voter is allowed to cast a ballot or an 10 eligible voter is prevented from casting a ballot. State and local election officials must protect the integrity of Washington elections 11 12 by ensuring our registration rolls contain only eligible citizens, and 13 that only legal votes are counted. This commonsense measure to help 14 prevent our elections from being corrupted by fraud will restore 15 integrity to the ballot box.

Ensure Only Eligible Citizens Are Registered to Vote

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW
 to read as follows:

3 "FULL LEGAL NAME." As used in this chapter, "full legal name" 4 means the voter's full name at birth, including first, middle, and last 5 name, or the voter's full name as legally changed by a court of law or 6 by marriage.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW 8 to read as follows:

9 DOCUMENTS THAT DEMONSTRATE CITIZENSHIP. Proof of citizenship may 10 be demonstrated by any of the following documents:

11 (1) A birth certificate that verifies citizenship to the 12 satisfaction of the county auditor or secretary of state;

13 (2) A United States passport identifying the applicant and the 14 applicant's passport number;

(3) A United States naturalization document or the number of the certificate of naturalization. If only the number of the certificate of naturalization is provided, the applicant shall not be included in the registration rolls until the county auditor or secretary of state verifies the number of the certificate of naturalization with the United States bureau of citizenship and immigration services or another appropriate federal agency;

(4) The applicant's bureau of Indian affairs card number, tribal
 treaty card number, or tribal enrollment number;

(5) Other documents or methods of proof that are authorized underthe federal immigration reform and control act of 1986; or

(6) Documents identified by the United States department of state and published in the Code of Federal Regulations as acceptable documentary evidence of United States citizenship or nationality for a United States passport application.

30 Sec. 4. RCW 29A.08.210 and 2005 c 246 s 11 are each amended to 31 read as follows:

32 <u>(1)</u> An applicant for voter registration shall complete an 33 application providing the following information concerning his or her 34 qualifications as a voter in this state:

35 (((1))) (a) The residential address of the last former registration 36 of the applicant as a voter in the state;

37 ((((2))) (b) The applicant's full legal name;

- (((3))) (c) The applicant's date of birth;

2 (((++))) (d) The address of the applicant's residence for voting
3 purposes;

4 (((5))) (e) The mailing address of the applicant if that address is
5 not the same as the address in subsection (((4))) (1)(d) of this

(((6))) <u>(f)</u> The sex of the applicant;

8 (((7))) (<u>q</u>) The applicant's Washington state driver's license 9 number or Washington state identification card number, or the last four 10 digits of the applicant's Social Security number if he or she does not 11 have a Washington state driver's license or Washington state 12 identification card;

13 (((8))) (<u>h</u>) A check box for the applicant to indicate that he or 14 she does not have a Washington state driver's license, Washington state 15 identification card, or Social Security number;

16 (((9))) (i) A check box allowing the applicant to indicate that he 17 or she is a member of the armed forces, national guard, or reserves, or 18 that he or she is an overseas voter;

19 ((((10))) (j) A check box allowing the applicant to confirm that he 20 or she is at least eighteen years of age;

(((11))) (k) Clear and conspicuous language, designed to draw the applicant's attention, stating that the applicant must be a United States citizen in order to register to vote, that the applicant must submit the documents described in subsection (2) of this section with the application, and that the county auditor or secretary of state must reject the application if the applicant fails to include these documents;

28 (((12))) (1) A check box and declaration confirming that the 29 applicant is a citizen of the United States;

(((13))) <u>(m)</u> The following warning:

31 "If you knowingly provide false information on this voter 32 registration form or knowingly make a false declaration about your 33 qualifications for voter registration you will have committed a class 34 C felony that is punishable by imprisonment for up to five years, a 35 fine of up to ten thousand dollars, or both."

(((14))) <u>(n)</u> The following affirmation by the applicant:

37 "By signing this document, I hereby assert, under penalty of 38 perjury, that I am legally eligible to vote. If I am found to have 39 voted illegally, I may be prosecuted and/or fined for this illegal act. In addition, I hereby acknowledge that my name and last known address will be forwarded to the appropriate state and/or federal authorities if I am found to have voted illegally."

4 (((15))) <u>(o)</u> The oath required by RCW 29A.08.230 and a space for 5 the applicant's signature; and

6 (((16))) <u>(p)</u> Any other information that the secretary of state 7 determines is necessary to establish the identity of the applicant and 8 prevent duplicate or fraudulent voter registrations.

9 This information shall be recorded on a single registration form to 10 be prescribed by the secretary of state.

11 (2) The applicant must submit copies of the following documents 12 with the registration form:

13 (a) A legible copy of a document proving United States citizenship; 14 and

15 (b) If a felon, a legible copy of a document proving voting rights
16 have been restored.

17 <u>The county auditor, registration assistants, and persons or</u> 18 <u>organizations who collect voter registration forms must provide copying</u> 19 <u>service at no charge to applicants who provide original documents in</u> 20 <u>person. Persons who register by mail must include copies of original</u> 21 <u>documents with their applications.</u>

22 (3) After two years, the county auditor or secretary of state may 23 destroy all documents required by subsection (2) of this section that 24 were submitted with the registration form.

25 (4) If the applicant fails to provide the information required for 26 voter registration, the auditor shall send the applicant a verification 27 notice. The applicant may not be registered until the required 28 information is provided. If a verification notice is returned as 29 undeliverable or the applicant fails to respond to the notice within forty-five days, the applicant shall not be registered to vote until 30 31 the applicant completes a new form and provides all required 32 information and documentation.

33 Sec. 5. RCW 29A.08.110 and 2005 c 246 s 5 are each amended to read 34 as follows:

(1) An application is considered complete only if it contains the
 information required by RCW 29A.08.210 including, but not limited to,
 the applicant's legal name, complete valid residence address, date of
 birth, signature attesting to the truth of the information provided, a

1 mark in the check-off box confirming United States citizenship, and an 2 indication that proof of citizenship and the provided driver's license number, state identification card number, or Social Security number 3 ((has)) have been confirmed by the secretary of state. 4 The county 5 auditor shall also review the residential address provided on the registration form and verify, by checking county property records or 6 7 other similar records, that the address provided contains an actual 8 residential unit or is a nontraditional address under RCW 29A.08.112. 9 If the auditor is unable to verify that the address on the registration form contains an actual residence, or is not a nontraditional address, 10 the application shall not be considered complete. If it is not 11 12 complete, the auditor shall promptly mail a verification notice of the 13 deficiency to the applicant. This verification notice shall require 14 the applicant to provide the missing information. If the auditor has 15 been unable to verify that the residential address on the registration form is an actual residence, then the verification notice shall require 16 17 the registrant to either provide the correct residential address or 18 declare by signed oath that the address provided is the registrant's 19 true abode. If the verification notice is not returned by the 20 applicant within forty-five days or is returned as undeliverable, the 21 name of the applicant shall not be placed on the official list of 22 registered voters <u>until the applicant completes a new form and provides</u> all required information and documentation. If the applicant provides 23 24 the required verified information, the applicant shall be registered to 25 vote as of the original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever 26 is applicable.

27 (2) If the information required in subsection (1) of this section 28 is complete, the applicant is considered to be registered to vote as of 29 the original date of mailing or date of delivery, whichever is applicable. The auditor shall record the appropriate precinct 30 date 31 taxing district identification, identification, and of registration on the voter's record in the state voter registration 32 Within forty-five days after the receipt of an application but 33 list. 34 no later than seven days before the next primary, special election, or general election, the auditor shall send to the applicant, by first 35 36 class mail, an acknowledgement notice identifying the registrant's 37 precinct and containing such other information as may be required by 38 the secretary of state. The postal service shall be instructed not to

forward a voter registration card to any other address and to return to
 the auditor any card which is not deliverable.

3 (3) If an acknowledgement notice card is properly mailed as required by this section to the address listed by the voter as being 4 5 the voter's mailing address and the notice is subsequently returned to the auditor by the postal service as being undeliverable to the voter 6 at that address, the auditor shall promptly send the voter a 7 8 confirmation notice. The auditor shall place the voter's registration 9 on inactive status pending a response from the voter to the confirmation notice. 10

Update Existing Registrations to Verify Eligibility

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 29A.04 RCW 13 to read as follows:

14 "PENDING STATUS." "Pending status" means the status of a voter who 15 has not updated his or her registration information to the requirements 16 of RCW 29A.08.210.

17 **Sec. 7.** RCW 29A.08.615 and 2003 c 111 s 238 are each amended to 18 read as follows:

19 Registered voters are divided into ((two)) three categories, 20 "active," "pending," and "inactive." All registered voters are 21 classified as active, unless assigned to inactive <u>or pending</u> status by 22 the county auditor.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. A new section is added to chapter 29A.08 RCW 24 to read as follows:

25 REQUIREMENTS FOR UPDATING REGISTRATION. (1) The county auditor 26 shall mail an update notice before January 31, 2008, to all voters who 27 registered to vote after January 1, 1995, and before the effective date 28 of this act. The county auditor shall mail subsequent update notices 29 not less than once every six months until October 1, 2009, to 30 registrants who have not updated their registrations.

(2) Update notices must be on a form prescribed by, or approved by, the secretary of state and must require that the voter provide his or her full legal name and proof of United States citizenship to the county auditor, either in person or by mail, prior to October 1, 2009,

in order to maintain an active registration. The notice must include
 a list of acceptable documents for proving citizenship.

3 (3) On October 1, 2009, the county auditor shall reassign all voters to pending status who registered to vote after January 1, 1995, 4 5 and before the effective date of this act and who have not provided their full legal name or proof of United States citizenship to the 6 7 county auditor. The county auditor shall notify these voters of the 8 status change, including in the notice an explanation of how to be 9 returned to active status as described in subsection (4) of this 10 section.

11 (4) The county auditor shall return a voter who has been placed on 12 pending status under this section to active voter status if the voter 13 provides his or her full legal name and proof of citizenship to the 14 county auditor. This may be done in person at the auditor's office; by 15 mail in response to the update notice; by mail with an absentee or mail 16 ballot; or in person to a poll worker before voting at a poll site. The county auditor shall mail an acknowledgment notice to a voter who 17 18 has updated their registration under this section. The acknowledgement 19 notice shall be processed in the same manner as in RCW 29A.08.110.

(5) Beginning on the date the voter was assigned to pending status and ending on the day of the second general election for federal office that occurs after the date that the voter was sent the status notice required in subsection (3) of this section, if the voter fails to take any of the actions described in subsection (4) of this section the auditor shall cancel the person's voter registration.

26 (6) Any voter placed on pending status under this section who 27 attempts to vote without providing his or her full legal name and proof 28 of citizenship shall be issued a provisional ballot. The county 29 auditor shall not count the provisional ballot unless the voter provides his or her full legal name and proof of citizenship to the 30 31 county auditor before the date the election is certified by the county. 32 Upon receiving this documentation the auditor shall return the voter to active status as provided in subsection (3) of this section. 33

Improve Absentee Ballot Security

35 **Sec. 9.** RCW 29A.40.091 and 2005 c 246 s 21 are each amended to 36 read as follows:

1 The county auditor shall send each absentee voter a ballot, a 2 security envelope in which to seal the ballot after voting, a larger 3 envelope in which to return the security envelope, and instructions on how to mark the ballot and how to return it to the county auditor. 4 The 5 instructions that accompany an absentee ballot for a partisan primary must include instructions for voting the applicable ballot style, as 6 7 provided in chapter 29A.36 RCW. The absentee voter's name and address 8 must be printed on the larger return envelope, which must also contain 9 a declaration by the absentee voter reciting his or her qualifications and stating that he or she has not voted in any other jurisdiction at 10 11 this election, together with a summary of the penalties for any 12 violation of any of the provisions of this chapter. The declaration 13 must clearly inform the voter that it is illegal to vote if he or she 14 is not a United States citizen; it is illegal to vote if he or she has 15 been convicted of a felony and has not had his or her voting rights 16 restored; and, except as otherwise provided by law, it is illegal to cast a ballot or sign an absentee envelope on behalf of another voter. 17 18 The return envelope must provide space for the voter to indicate the 19 date on which the ballot was voted and for the voter to sign the oath. 20 It must also contain a space so that the voter may include a telephone 21 number. A summary of the applicable penalty provisions of this chapter 22 must be printed on the return envelope immediately adjacent to the 23 space for the voter's signature. The signature of the voter on the 24 return envelope must affirm and attest to the statements regarding the 25 qualifications of that voter and to the validity of the ballot. The 26 return envelope must also have a secrecy flap that the voter may seal 27 that will cover the voter's signature and optional telephone number. 28 For out-of-state voters, overseas voters, and service voters, the 29 signed declaration on the return envelope constitutes the equivalent of a voter registration for the election or primary for which the ballot 30 31 The voter must be instructed to either return the has been issued. ballot to the county auditor by whom it was issued or attach sufficient 32 first class postage, if applicable, and mail the ballot to the 33 34 appropriate county auditor no later than the day of the election or primary for which the ballot was issued. 35

36 ((If the county auditor chooses to forward absentee ballots, he or 37 she must include with the ballot a clear explanation of the 38 qualifications necessary to vote in that election and must also advise 39 a voter with questions about his or her eligibility to contact the

1 county auditor. This explanation may be provided on the ballot 2 envelope, on an enclosed insert, or printed directly on the ballot 3 itself. If the information is not included, the envelope must clearly 4 indicate that the ballot is not to be forwarded and that return postage 5 is guaranteed.)) The county auditor shall instruct the postal service 6 to not forward absentee ballots to any other address and to return to 7 the auditor any absentee ballot which is not deliverable.

Limit Ballot Interpretation By Election Workers

9 Sec. 10. RCW 29A.60.125 and 2005 c 243 s 10 are each amended to 10 read as follows:

11 If inspection of the ballot reveals a physically damaged ballot or 12 ballot ((that may be otherwise unreadable or uncountable by the 13 tabulating system)) where the voter has corrected an error in voting according to instructions issued by election officials , the county 14 auditor may refer the ballot to the county canvassing board or 15 16 duplicate the ballot if so authorized by the county canvassing board. 17 The voter's original ballot may not be altered. A damaged ballot or a 18 ballot where the voter has corrected an error in voting may be 19 duplicated only if the intent of the voter's marks on the ballot is 20 clear and the electronic voting equipment might not otherwise properly 21 tally the ballot to reflect the intent of the voter. Ballots must be 22 duplicated by teams of two or more people working together. When 23 duplicating ballots, the county auditor shall take the following steps 24 to create and maintain an audit trail of the action taken:

(1) Each original ballot and duplicate ballot must be assigned the same unique control number, with the number being marked upon the face of each ballot, to ensure that each duplicate ballot may be tied back to the original ballot;

29 (2) A log must be kept of the ballots duplicated, which must at 30 least include:

31 (a) The control number of each original ballot and the 32 corresponding duplicate ballot;

33 (b) The initials of at least two people who participated in the 34 duplication of each ballot; and

35 (c) The total number of ballots duplicated.

Original and duplicate ballots must be sealed in secure storage at
 all times, except during duplication, inspection by the canvassing
 board, or tabulation.

Add Safeguards Against Double Voting

5 Sec. 11. RCW 29A.44.090 and 2003 c 111 s 1109 are each amended to 6 read as follows:

7 A registered voter shall not be allowed to vote in the precinct in 8 which he or she is registered at any election or primary for which that 9 voter has cast an absentee ballot. A registered voter who has 10 requested an absentee ballot for a primary or special or general 11 election but chooses to vote at the voter's precinct polling place in 12 that primary or election shall cast a provisional ballot. The 13 canvassing board shall not count the provisional ballot until all 14 absentee ballots have been counted or if it finds that the voter has 15 also voted by absentee ballot in that primary or election.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 12. RCW 29A.08.010 ("Information required for 17 voter registration.") and 2006 c 320 s 2, 2005 c 246 s 2, 2004 c 267 s 18 102, 2003 c 111 s 201, & 1994 c 57 s 9 are each repealed.

19 Construction, Severability, and Miscellaneous Provisions

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 13.** CONSTRUCTION. The provisions of this act 21 are to be liberally construed to effectuate the intent, policies, and 22 purposes of this act.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 14. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this act 24 or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 25 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 26 persons or circumstances is not affected.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 15. Subheadings and captions used in this act 28 are not part of the law.

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 16.** This act shall be known and cited as the 30 Restoring Integrity to Elections Act.
